Goals of the Program:

Because of the particular challenges posed by the cognitive and developmental changes that mark adolescence, treatment for adolescent substance use requires a distinctive approach that recognizes and respects adolescents' desire for independence while understanding the special vulnerabilities of this period of life. The Pediatric Addiction Medicine Rotation at Boston Children's Hospital provides fellows in addiction medicine a one-week observational training experience that focuses on evaluation and treatment for adolescents and young adults with substance use problems and disorders.

Training:

Spots will be filled as applications come in until they are full. Over the course of the week, the fellow will be provided with the following training opportunities:

- 16 hours of clinical observation of telehealth in the Adolescent Substance Use and Addiction Program (ASAP), including time spent with pediatricians, social workers, and psychiatrists.
- Participation in ASAP virtual clinical rounds
- Opportunity to attend virtual research and service delivery meetings
- Opportunity to access materials from research and clinical didactics during and after rotation
