ACAAM's external relations efforts amplify advocacy, expand collaboration, and advance the field of academic addiction medicine.

- **Organizational Engagement:** ACAAM engaged with **12 nonprofit and federal organizations** representing the interests of academic addiction medicine specialists.
- **Partnerships:** Launched a new ACAAM Partnerships webpage, highlighting **9 formal partnerships** with organizations, publications, and trusted voices in the field.
- **Advocacy:** Issued **6 letters and endorsements** for legislation impacting academic addiction medicine professionals, trainees, and programs.
